OXA AGM set for September 21st

OXA President Joan Byrne is stepping down after two years in the post and Vice-president Sharon Spring will move into the top spot, after serving as the director responsible for jump-starting our social media presence in the past couple of years.

Treasurer Amanda Price has welcomed a new little Price into her household, so is taking a leave of absence from the board and Secretary Lisa Masini, also one of the association's founders, is stepping down from that role but continuing as a director.

Thanks to the efforts of a board recruitment committee, several OXA members have stepped up and offered to fill some of the vacancies on the board.

They include Kyla Fortushniok of Penticton who is a recent arrival in the valley and passionate about gardening and eager to learn more about xeriscape. She has a background in education and a sound knowledge of social media. Fall Plant Sale of Xeriscape Perennials

Because fall is the best time of year to plant perennials—giving them an opportunity to establish root systems in their new environments prior to the heat and drought of spring and summer—OXA is holding its third annual fall plant sale Sat., Sept. 21, from 10 a.m. to 12 p.m.

It will be held at the Xeriscape Demonstration Garden on Gordon Drive in Kelowna, in front of the H2O Aquatic Centre. It's called the UnH2O Garden. This is a great opportunity not only to purchase new, drought-tolerant plants and shrubs but also the perfect chance to ask questions of knowledgeable xeriscapers, Master Gardeners, specialists in native plants and even fellow gardeners. You will also have a chance to purchase native plants from XEN nursery and xeriscape and native plants from Wild Bloom Nursery.

There will be a wide range of sedums available, from ground covers to tall varieties, and in lots of different leaf and flower colours.

We will have both prostrate and upright sedums available which can easily be incorporated into any dry area of your garden, ideally sited in full or part sun. Sedums are not particular about soil, thriving in poor, dry, and rocky soil, but they are intolerant of winter wet which can lead to root rot.

A little tip to avoid this is simply plant your sedums a bit higher than the surrounding soil, to encourage adequate drainage. We will have the tall sedums 'Autumn Joy' and 'Mr. Goodbud' available, both of which are coming into bloom now in shades of rosy-pink, and both provide late season nectar for a variety of pollinators.

Of the lower-growing sedum, we have 'Angelina', 'Blue spruce', 'Lime twister', 'Firecracker', and Sedum stenopetalum all offering interesting texture and foliage colour even when not in bloom.

We will also have a variety of grasses available, including Panicum virgatum 'Heavy Metal' and 'Blood Brothers' which offer fantastic visual interest in the garden as they reach up to five feet in height. Visit the demonstration garden now to see 'Heavy Metal' in bloom. 'Blood Brothers' transitions to a stunning bright red as the temperature falls. Also featured at the sale is the awardwinning Shizachyrium scorparium 'Standing Ovation'. This cultivar of the North American native Bluestem grass ages to shades of maroon and red, retaining its colour into the winter months.

We are urgently calling for volunteers to help run the plant sale, in roles such as at the tally desk, cash desk, and as garden ambassadors. We also need help to set up and clean up.
