They also adore full sun and thrive on just a little supplemental water—important in drought

There's no shortage of rocks in our little corner of the world —so we got busy and began to gather up the ones we liked the look of. We had all the 'danger trees' cut down and carted away the charred remains of our landscaping; got the stumps ground down; soil trucked in; and began to dig out a 'dry' pond from which the rockery would rise up in an arc where trees

Ornamental grasses included in the planting were Helictotrichon sempervirens (Blue Oat Grass) and Panicum virgatum 'Shenandoah' (Switch grass). All of the plants chosen for Angela's garden are drought-tolerant and support a wide variety of pollinators. 




