Looking back on 2024—and forward to 2025



The past year, celebrating the 15th year since the Okanagan Xeriscape Association was first envisioned and created by Gwen Steele and Lisa Masini, has been a rewarding and growing year for us all.



The coming year, celebrating the 15th year since the UnH2O Xeriscape Demonstration Garden was created in Kelowna, will be a year of update and renewal in that garden. With several new board members, it will also be a year of renovation and renewal for the organization as each begins to influence the direction and scope of OXA, according to their experience and expertise.

Renewal is vital to the health of both gardens and volunteer organizations such as OXA so we're looking forward to an exciting year.

Last year, we welcomed a record number of new members and expanded our reach and influence on social media, with a total of 2,218 Facebook followers, 20 per cent over the previous year; and 1,056 Instagram followers, up 36 per cent from the previous year. Overall post views were also up, with 80,000 on Facebook and nearly 38,000 on Instagram. We welcome one of those new board members to head up our social media presence. Thanks to Kyla Fortushniok for volunteering for that role, allowing our previous 'social media face' to slide into her new role as president of OXA. Thanks and welcome to our new 'boss' Sharon Spring.

We now have 10 board members, ranging from two founding directors to a few brand new ones; and including people with a broad range of experience from writing to accounting; construction to landscaping; irrigation to web technology, marketing to biology and everything in-between.

It's a great group of volunteers who work together well as a team, respecting each other's knowledge and opinions.

In the broader community, the past year was also one of restoration and renewal after the wildfires of 2023 and I think we all have a new appreciation for ways in which we surround our homes and community with less flammable plantings in order to minimize damage due to climate change and its extremes.

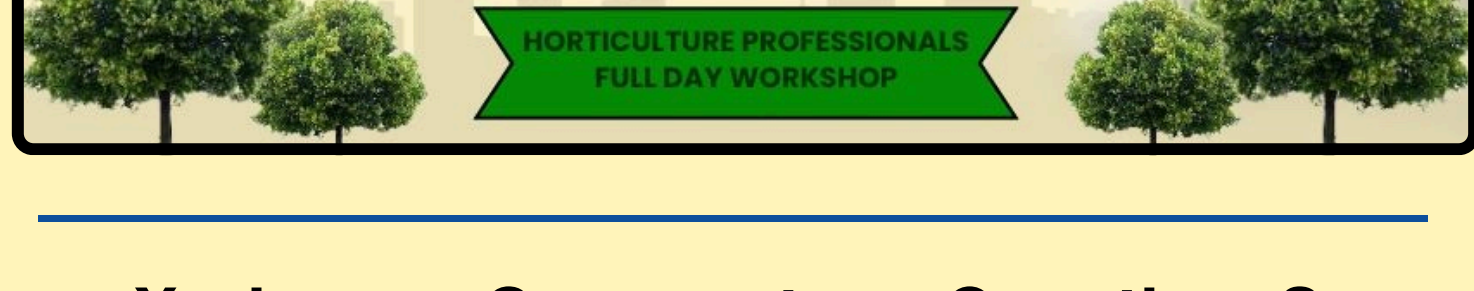

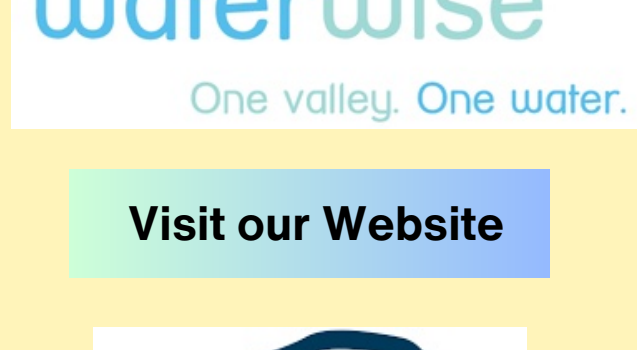
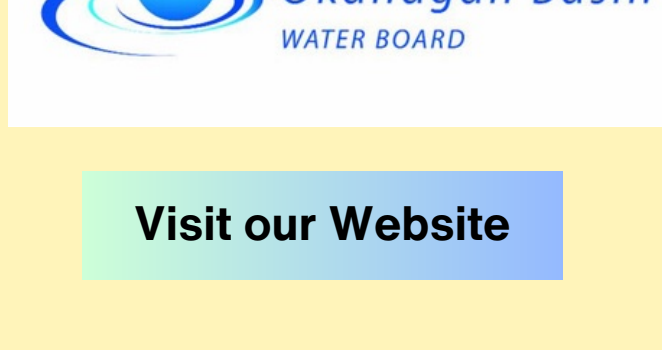
